IV. Discuss and take action for the Campbell County Board of Education to move full-time classified support staff from the county health insurance plan to the state health insurance plan to come into compliance with the requirements of the Local Education (LE) Plan.

Motion by Miller, second by James to approve moving full-time classified support staff from the county health insurance plan to the state health insurance plan to come into compliance with the requirements of the Local Education (LE) Plan.

Board member Miller stated that in reading and watching the video of the meeting, he was puzzled regarding the request from the Board of Education. Board member Miller stated he does not remember this, and it looked like it had the finance department blessing. Board member Miller stated he was referencing the Local Education Insurance Committee meeting. Director Fields addressed the email addressed to Mr. Jeff Marlow from Laurie Lee, dated June 6, 2022, and stated she did not have knowledge of this. Board member Miller asked if the state statue changed in 2015. Ms. Lee replied yes. Ms. Lee stated an update MOU was done in 2014 and 2019 highlighting that you cannot offer other plans. Board member James asked when moving forward if then local plan could be shopped in the future, or does it have to be a state plan. Ms. Lee stated it has to pass test and has to be the same offered coverage. Other LEA opts into other plans. If the Board of Education plan is outside state plan, the Board of Education would lose retiree funding prior hiring of June 2015. Ms. Gargaro stated if Board of Education move teachers to county and leave state plan, retirees have to move

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to the plan also. Board member Miller stated a single plus 1 is \$350.00 per year and the family is \$800 per year. We have made budget cuts over the past four year, adding all this up could be a savings of \$250,000 in premiums cost if they go to the state plan. Board member Miller also asked Ms. Lee if in 2019, the finance department would have known at that time there could only be one health plan. Ms. Lee stated on the Memorandum of Understanding was in black and white that there could only be 1 health plan for the LEA, and the finance department signed the (MOU).

Board member Morgan asked if there would be help with transitioning. Ms. Lee stated yes, they would make a smooth transition. Board member Heatherly asked if there are additional state plans that could offer savings for our employees. MS. Lee stated they offer dental and vision. Board member Heatherly recommended looking into this in the future. Board member Morgan asked how the affected employees would be notified. Ms. Lee stated they would work closely with the finance department regarding the employees.

Motion by Miller, second by James to approve moving full-time classified support staff from the county health insurance plan to the state health insurance plan to come into compliance with the requirements of the Local Education (LE) Plan.

Board member Byrge asked if there would be anyone without insurance during the transition. Ms. Lee stated coverage is through this calendar year of December 31, 2022. Coverage would start January 1, 2023. Director Fields asked if the system could lose funding if not in compliance.
